Into The Neighborhood

"The Word became flesh and blood, and moved into the neighborhood." John 1:14 (MSG)

In John's gospel, God speaks salvation into history. How does God set about accomplishing such a huge mission? We might be tempted to tackle this with a top-down approach, or a televised media blitz. Eugene Peterson reminds us that God's strategy was from the bottom- up; the Word comes to us in human form and enters history as a living human being. He comes to us as a person. He lives in a specific town. He has real neighbors with names, personalities, joys, and sorrows!

Metamora Mennonite also embraces a big mission to make God known. Might MMC incorporate some of this neighborhood strategy to become "flesh and blood" to the town in which we each live? Each of us lives in a particular town, and we have real neighbors. What could happen if we begin to imagine with faith how this could be more concretely lived out? What if salvation is experienced through leisurely conversations, growing personal relationships, and responses to life's comings and goings?

Therefore, MMC's Discipleship Team invites you to participate in a neighbor group, a small group offering. Our church attendees are scattered geographically in many towns. These groups will add a local offering that can complement our large group gathering on Sunday morning. Here is another option for the other six days. The structure of these groups is intentionally simple. They will meet once a month, in the individual towns, September through May. They will be facilitated by 2-3 co-leaders, and the meeting time won't be overly long (50-70 minutes).

The purpose of Neighbor Groups is to:

- Support community life at MMC: partnering with the larger structure of our church.
- Provide a time, place and pace to build relationships and share life together with intergenerational gatherings.
- Enjoy a smaller, more personal setting as we gather in smaller groups, often in homes.
- Work together with other Ministry Teams to accomplish ministry goals (members being cared for in practical ways: a place for individuals to discern and practice their gifts: opportunities to witness to those around us: places for service and mission).
- Be an "on-ramp" for those exploring church and for new attendees.
- Be an additional church option for those unable to attend on Sunday mornings, due to illness or schedules.

"Your sins are released from you."

And again, entering into Capernaum, after (several) days it became known that he was at home. And many gathered, so that (the house) no longer could hold things, even near the door. And he was speaking the word to them.

And they came, bringing to him a paralyzed man who was being carried by four persons. And not being able to bring (the paralyzed man) to him on account of the crowd, they unroofed the roof where he was, and after digging through they let down the bed where the paralyzed man was lying down.

And Jesus, after seeing their trust, said to the paralyzed man, "My son, your sins are released from you." Mark 2:1-5 AT

Who would not want their sins distanced, sent away, separated? Left lying, released, remitted, pardoned, forgiven. We find this verb in verses Mark 2: 5, 7, 9, and 10.

The *word* Jesus was speaking to them, the *good news*, most assuredly was "God loves you. You are accepted. 'God is not angry with you.'"¹ And to the paralyzed man, "Your paralysis is not due to your sinning."

God's steadfast rescuing love distances our sins, separating them from us, so they are left lying and forgiven. We don't have to always carry their weight.
